SENATE BILL 1: POLICY AND REFORM MANDATES FOR TEACHER EDUCATION PROGRAMS

OPPORTUNITIES AND ISSUES

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What Is Senate Bill 1?

- ❖ KRS 158.6451 is Kentucky's most recent education reform act.
- Includes policy mandates for outcomes in P-12 and Higher Education.



What Does Senate Bill 1 Include?

- Emphases include revision of:
 - Core Content Academic Standards
 - P-12 school, district, and state-level assessment processes for elementary, middle, and high school levels.
 - Mandates for professional development for P-12 and Higher Education.
 - Mandates for alignment of BOTH teacher preparation programs
 AND disciplinary coursework with state standards for P-12
 "College and Career Readiness".
 - Mandates for increased retention and graduation, increased academic achievement, and decreased remediation of students at all levels including higher education.



SB 1 Mandates for Teacher Educators

- Disseminate content standards to preservice candidates and education stakeholders.
- Engage in deconstructing Kentucky Core Academic Standards
 - Mathematics, English language arts, and literacy across the content areas
 - —Social Studies and Science (under development)
- Collaborate with EPSB to analyze and improve training for content area writing instruction at the pre-service level
- Educate teachers re: Kentucky's Characteristics of Highly Effective Teaching and Learning (CHETL) and their practical applications



SB 1 Mandates for Teacher Educators

- Collaborate with EPSB and CPE to provide statewide needsassessment and deliver professional development re:
 - 1. Reducing achievement gaps
 - 2. Differentiated instruction in all content areas
 - 3. School-based decision making
 - 4. Assessment literacy
 - 5. Performance-based student assessment in daily instruction
 - 6. Research-based instruction



- 7. Instructional uses of technology
- 8. Culturally responsive teaching
- 9. Reading Instruction
- 10. Educational leadership
- 11. Character education
- 12. Writing instruction



SB 1 Responsibilities/Duties for Teacher Educators

- Develop course syllabi to actively engage SB 1 elements, alignment of standards/objectives, program reviews, classroom assessment, and the state accountability assessment systems
- Prepare candidates to translate standards into clear learning targets and design high quality assessments
- Collaborate across colleges, departments, and P-12 partnerships to create and share models
- Prepare candidates to analyze student achievement data, diagnose needs, and design instruction for strategic improvement



SB 1 Responsibilities/Duties for Teacher Educators

- Provide candidates with classroom and field experiences re: rigorous standards-based instruction
- Integrate and model research-based and effective assessment practices
- Prepare candidates to understand, implement, and explain state assessment systems



SB 1 Responsibilities/Duties for Teacher Educators

- Coach candidates to communicate with stakeholders re: student performance
- Implement new EPSB Program Review Document (PRD) requirements and Kentucky Teacher Intern Program (KTIP) elements and tasks in teacher education course syllabi, field and clinical experiences, and assessment systems



Characteristics of Highly Effective Teaching and Learning (CHETL)

- Learning climate
- Classroom assessment and reflection
- Instructional rigor and student engagement
- Instructional relevance
- Knowledge of content



Summary of SB 1 for Teacher Education Programs

- Senate Bill 1 requires higher education faculty to INCREASE GRADUATION RATES and to DEVELOP CAREER READINESS in college students.
- Standards are NOT a curriculum.
- Standards describe what students should be able to do. KCAS and CCSSO explicitly and intentionally DO NOT prescribe methods or attempt to mandate curriculum and instruction
- Higher Education Institutions are required by SB 1 to demonstrate alignment of course content with the Kentucky Core Academic Standards
 - Teacher preparation courses
 - College and Career-Readiness assessment in college programs
